

MONEY: Please pick up the envelope containing your pledge card. Envelopes not picked up will be mailed at a cost to the Church of approximately \$1.00 each. As we have previously

discussed, a "pledge" is but a good faith "guesstimate" of what you reasonably anticipate to give to the Church for God's work for the up coming year. It is but an estimate. Life happens, both good and bad which results giving more or less money then pledged. Pledging allows the Church leadership to create a budget for the next year.

TIME and TALENT: The various activities and outreaches of the St. Vincent's require parishioners to step forward to assume leadership positions. The opportunity will arise for you to assume such role, or to assists others whom have done so. For the Church to grow and thrive it requires work and commitment. The call to serve God goes beyond attending church services most Sundays. Discrepancy in Revenue due to Vestry designated funds not being transferred until end of year when we better know how much is needed to balance budget. Expense variances are explained by budget being spread evenly throughout year, unplanned tree work, new insurance company billing delay along with switching from Ten Pay to monthly, and additional cost for Priest-in-Charge versus Supply Clergy.

An updated outlook indicates we may finish the year using less of the \$62,000 in-

heritance fund as originally planned. A draft budget has been prepared which shows our total expenses at \$321,308 versus our 2025 budget of \$304,547.



Saint of the Month



Martin of Tours, one of the patron saints of France, was born about 330 at Sabaria, the modern Szombathely in Hungary. His early years were spent in Pavia in Italy. After a term of service in the Roman army, he traveled around Europe and finally settled in Poitiers, whose bishop, Hilary, he had come to admire.

According to an old legend, while Martin was still a catechumen, he was approached by a poor man, who asked for alms in the name of Christ. Martin, drawing his sword, cut off part of his military cloak and gave it to the beggar. On the following night, Jesus appeared to Martin, clothed in half a

cloak, and said to the saints and angels surrounding him, "Martin, a simple catechumen, covered me with this garment."

Martin was baptized, but believed that his commitment as a Christian required him to leave the army, saying famously: "I am a soldier of Christ. I cannot fight." Martin pursued the vocation of a hermit for some years until, to his dismay, he was elected as Bishop of Tours in 372. He agreed to serve only if he were allowed to continue his strict, ascetic way of life. His monastery of Marmoutier, near Tours, had a great influence on the development of Celtic monasticism in Britain, where Ninian, among others, promoted Martin's ascetic and missionary ideals.

Martin was unpopular with many of his episcopal colleagues, both because of his manner of life and because of his strong opposition to their violent repression of heresy. Martin believed that heretics should be persuaded by sound preaching and by the testimony of holy lives rather than by force. He was a diligent missionary to the pagans in the countryside near his hermitage and was always a staunch defender of the poor and the marginalized.

Martin died on November 8, 397, but he has long been commemorated on November 11, the date of his burial. His shrine at Tours became a popular site for pilgrimages and a secure sanctuary for those seeking protection and justice.



Classic Pumpkin Pie

1/2 C. Granulated Sugar

1/4 C. packed Brown Sugar

1/2 teaspoon Salt

1 teaspoon ground Cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground Ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground Cloves

1 unbaked deep dish Pie Shell

2 Eggs, slightly beaten

15oz. can solid pack Pumpkin Puree

1 1/3 C. Half & Half cream

Combine sugar, salt, and spices in a small bowl. Put pumpkin in a large bowl and stir in sugar, spices, and eggs. Gradually whisk in half & half. Pour into pie shell. Bake in preheated oven at 425° F for 15 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350°F and bake for 45-55 minutes or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Cool on wire rack for 3 hours. Serve immediately or chill. Do not freeze.
