office administrator.



And I anticipate we will have the remaining trees "inoculated" to prevent pine beetle attack which destroys the trees. The customary fee for this service is approximately \$80,000 which has been reduced for our Parish to \$20,000. The bottom line is we are about to spend \$30,000 on trees!

On Saturday, August 9th at 8:00am we will install hurricane protection on the large glass doors. We need eight men (or four strong women) for the task. We anticipate being completed not later than 11:00am. Let Russ Lynn know you will help.

The Thrift Shop is going well and we very much appreciate the work Berry and her team have invested in keeping the Shop operating.

Year-to-Date Budget Revenue includes transfer of \$31,000 from Inheritance Fund (a total of \$62,000 by year end), however, only the \$10,613 put aside for Yearly Apportionment Assessment was transferred from Inheritance Fund in June. Some expenses were budgeted evenly throughout the 12 months, and activity has not yet happened. A preliminary year-end outlook has been prepared which includes the addition of our new Priest-in-Charge, renting the Rectory, and removing the dead Pine trees surrounding the Memorial Garden. Outlook currently shows using \$58,000 of the \$62,000.

Thank you for your giving and to the ministry leaders managing their budgets. We are truly blessed and thankful for Fr. Richard Earle and Fr. Barry Kubler, and look forward to welcoming Fr. Scott Nonken.

Junior Warden Report



It's been a very busy month around our campus...here are just some of the highlights.

Trees: We have had our share of Pine Beetle problems in the last two years. When signs of Pine Beetle damage are noticed, the tree dies usually within 3 weeks. Just recently, we have lost 6 more pine trees beside our Memorial Garden due to Pine Beetle infestation. Those trees are scheduled to be removed the first week of Sept. We are also going to have the large pine tree adjacent to the Parish Hall building removed at the same

time to avoid the possibility of destruction to the Parish Hall were it to fall during a storm. Here's the good news – after consulting with two different arborists, we have decided to move forward with treating all of the trees on our property with a technique that basically "inoculates" the tree and discourages the Pine Beetle from attacking that tree. Faced with the real possibility of losing all our trees, we have to mitigate that possibility as best we can. Phase 1 inoculation will start the first week of August. Phase 2 inoculation takes place 6 months later. After both treatments, the Arborists believe the success rate should be approximately 90% successful. The arborist doing the treatment will reevaluate the trees in 24 to 36 months to see if there are any signs that a "booster" treatment might be needed. Both companies have given St Vincent's a substantial and generous price reduction as a donation to our Church.

Storm Prep Workday: We will be installing the metal storm panels on the sides of the Sanctuary in an effort to get ahead of any storms that may threaten us this season. We need 8 to 10 people that can help with this. The metal panels aren't heavy, just long. Wear gloves and we'll have a "system" in place that will make this job go smoothly. If you don't think you can contribute to this type of work, there is always some lighter weeding and trimming that is needed. As with all workdays, our goal is to get our chores done and be able to go home early! I'll be there at 7:30!

Pond: Our pond management company has treated the Duck weed and hyacinths at our request to reduce the amount of vegetative growth in the pond. The main purpose of the pond is to hold as much overflow water and discharge that water into the stormwater system as fast as possible during heavy rains. This work is ongoing and will be combined with the City clearing additional muck and debris out of the pond. We don't have a date when this work will occur, but we're on their list.

Thank you! Thank you to Sandra Stancil and her very dedicated crew of cleaning volunteers that showed up last week to do a "deep cleaning" of the kitchen. This wasn't a "dust and mop" social! There isn't a cleaner kitchen in Pinellas County!

A special "Thank you" to a few volunteers that routinely show up during the week to pull weeds, trim and keep our property in the beautiful condition that it is. Without their dedication, our property would not look as nice as it does! I won't mention names, but they know who they are!...

These are just two groups this month that get "The unsung hero award"!

Saint of the Month

St. Augustine of Hippo is the patron of brewers because of his conversion from a former life of loose living, which included parties, entertainment, and worldly ambitions. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

This famous son of St. Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and



his pride darkened his mind so much, that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the marvelous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day, however, he heard about two men who had suddenly been converted on reading the life of St. Antony, and he felt terrible ashamed of himself. "What are we doing?" he cried to his friend Alipius. "Unlearned people are taking Heaven by force, while we, with all our knowledge, are so cowardly that we keep rolling around in the mud of our sins!"

Full of bitter sorrow, Augustine flung himself out into the garden and cried out to God, "How long more, O Lord? Why does not this hour put an end to my sins?" Just then he heard a child sing-

ing, "Take up and read!" Thinking that God intended him to hear those words, he picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul, and read the first passage his gaze fell on. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. That did it! From then on, Augustine began a new life. He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, Founder of religious priests, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too. On the wall of his room he had the following sentence written in large letters: "Here we do not speak evil of anyone." St. Augustine overcame strong heresies, practiced great poverty and supported the poor, preached very often and prayed with great fervor right up until his death. "Too late have I loved You!" he once cried to God, but with his holy life he certainly made up for the sins he committed before his conversion. His feast day is August 28th.
