Jr. Warden Report

Wow! What a difference a few weeks can make in all of our lives. Hurricanes Helene and Milton left so many of us in "shock and awe" after passing through our beloved St. Petersburg! Our property survived the storm with quite a bit of tree damage but relatively little building damage.

We lost 12-14 large trees and a lot of branches. One tree actually fell on the rectory and was removed quickly with relatively little roof damage. Our roofing contractor was able to repair the roof immediately so the rectory didn't suffer any further damage.

We were able to get help from a couple of tree contractors working in the neighborhood to cut up and move most of the downed trees to the perimeter of the property where FEMA can assist in removing them from the site. This expense wasn't in our budget and it wasn't cheap! However, it had to be done. Please be patient with this phase of the cleanup as FEMA has a massive task ahead. I believe we may be looking at tree debris for quite a few months.

The City has been contacted regarding storm debris clogging the drainage overflow as well as some depressed ground areas above the damaged main drain pipe. They will be repairing this situation (hopefully soon). If you see any flagged-off areas, please stay clear.

On a brighter note: The Narthex renovation project is making progress. It already has a brighter and cleaner look. A few more things are planned so keep your eyes open for more to come. A special "Thank You" to Berry Ludwig for leading this project. She's had a lot of help from parishioners from the 10:00 service and the Hispanic service. Together they are making our buildings brighter!

Saint of the Month



LEO OF ROME BISHOP OF ROME, DOCTOR (10 NOV 461)

Leo I (440-461) and Gregory I (590-604) are the only two bishops of Rome commonly called "the Great." Leo, at a time when the capital of the Empire had been moved to Constantinople, and the government even in Italy no longer had its headquarters at Rome, was the most important official in the city. To him fell such prosaic tasks as supervising the distribution of grain imports and reorganizing the municipal fire department. When Attila and the Huns invaded Italy in 452, he negotiated their withdrawal, and when Gaiseric (or

Genseric) the Vandal captured Rome three years later, it was Leo who prevented the total destruction of the city. It is perhaps not surprising that the theory of papal supremacy gained much ground in his day.

In his day there were disagreements about the correct way to state the truth that Jesus Christ is both God and man. In 449 Leo wrote a letter (known as the Tome of Leo) to Bishop Flavian of Constantinople, in which he affirmed that Christ has two Natures in one Person. The letter was read in 451 by the Council of Chalcedon (the fourth Ecumenical Council), and judged by them to be sound doctrine. It contributed much to the creedal statements of that council.

Leo's influence on church government will naturally get mixed reviews. But for his defense of the belief that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, all Christians may thank God.

From a sermon by Leo the Great:

Although the universal Church of God is constituted of distinct orders of members, still, in spite of the many parts of its holy body, the Church subsists as an integral whole, just as the Apostle says: we are all one in Christ. . .

For all, regenerated in Christ, are made kings by the sign of the cross; they are consecrated priests by the oil of the Holy Spirit, so that beyond the special service of our ministry as priests, all spiritual and mature Christians know that they are a royal race and are sharers in the office of the priesthood. For what is more king-like that to find your-self ruler over your body after having surrendered your soul to God? And what is more priestly than to promise the Lord a pure conscience and to offer him in love unblemished victims on the alter of one's heart?
